Putting USAID's Local Capacity Strengthening Policy into Practice

Looking for innovative ways to engage with local partners? Learn more through the following case studies that highlight D4I's local partnerships in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC), Moldova, Nigeria, and Rwanda.



D4I has partnered with the Kinshasa School of Public Health in the DRC to evaluate the USAID-funded Integrated Health Program, focused on strengthening the country's health system. D4I put into practice USAID's LCS Policy and designed interventions with sustainability and the local system in mind.



In <u>Moldova</u>, Territorial Social Assistance Structures (TSAS) provide support to individuals and families to reduce adversity and promote social inclusion. Following a capacity assessment in 2020, D4I has developed and implemented a capacity strengthening plan to support TSAS.



In collaboration with <u>Data Research and Mapping Consult, Ltd. in Nigeria</u>, D4I implemented the RECAP tool to identify existing organizational strengths and opportunities for growth in qualitative data collection and analysis, quantitative data analysis, and results dissemination.



Rwanda's National Child Development Agency has partnered with D4I to improve the availability and use of data for policy and programmatic decision making to support children facing adversity. Capacity strengthening interventions were designed to correspond with the Government of Rwanda's goals and priorities with specific actions, roles, and expected outcomes outlined in the Monitoring and Evaluation Capacity Strengthening Plan.

Strengthening Local Research Capacity through Small Grants

Locally led research capacity strengthening can be a sustainable solution to building the evidence base to identify best practices in health and improve health outcomes. Small grants are one solution to promote research capacity. D4I funded four small grants and provided technical assistance to the sub-grantee teams.
