## **Evaluating USAID Nigeria's Health, Population, and Nutrition** (HPN) Activities

For the <u>Nigeria HPN Multi-Activity Evaluation</u>, D4I disseminated midline qualitative results at a <u>national-level validation meeting</u> in June and three state-level dissemination events in July/August.

## D4I's Work in Moldova Wins Multiple Awards

In June, D4I consortium partner <u>Palladium was awarded the "Support to Ukraine" Global Impact Award</u> from the International Stability Operations Association. The award recognizes D4I's support of Ukrainian refugees in Moldova. USAID/Moldova celebrated and shared the news on its <u>Facebook page</u>.

In September, the USAID Bureau for Policy, Planning, and Learning recognized <u>USAID/Moldova's D4I activity</u> for external collaboration and adaptive management. D4I was one of nine winners of the <u>2023 Collaborate</u>, <u>Learn</u>, <u>and Adapt (CLA) Case Competition</u> among more than 150 applicants. By harnessing the power of locally-led CLA, D4I has created a cultural shift in using data to improve child outcomes in <u>Moldova</u>.
